Author's Notes: Set during the summer following Tom's fifth year, *Between Love and Mercy* is a prequel to <u>Overcoming Prejudice</u>. Tom, in his own fashion, loves Walburga, but he knows that her family will forbid any union between them; he hopes that possession of the ring will be sufficient to establish him as a wizard from a powerful family. Despite these hopes, the ring bearing the Perevell coat of arms, which he steals from his uncle, does not recommend him to the House of Black.

Immediately following these events, Riddle uses the wand he takes from Morfin to kill his Muggle father and grandparents. He then plants false memories of the murders-to which Morfin later confesses and for which he is sentenced to Azkaban--into Morfin's mind. (HBP17)
